Workshop Meeting Minutes October 2, 2018 4:30PM

A county commissioner workshop meeting of the Stewart County Board was held on October 2, 2018. The meeting convened at 4:30PM at the Stewart County Courthouse with Chairman Joseph B. Williams presiding.

Public Appearance

Kenny Davis/Flint Construction – **John Deer Motor Grader Bid** – I do not have any prices at this time. Chairman stated that we will need a purchase and lease price for a 5-year term. The road superintendent will review prices and equipment to determine what the road department needs. The G-Grader is totally new and upgraded. All problems have been addressed with the Mr. Haynes (Road Superintendent). John Deere has no purchase agreement. We can include a maintenance plan if needed.

Reports

- A. County Manager (Mac Moye)
 - 1. <u>Brooklyn Pipe Extension.</u> Chairman Williams and I are meeting with DOT supervisor JD Abercrombie tomorrow morning, and Paul Rakel.
 - 2. <u>Stewart County Community Summit.</u> There were about 120 attendees. The next step will be to convene community meetings around each of the four major topics of Health and Safety, Recreation, Tourism and Economic Development and Education. <u>West Central Georgia Health District</u> area health district wants to monitor our progress for a formal study.
 - 3. CDBG Award. Commissioner Joe Lee Williams and I will attend the awards dinner on Oct. 10.
 - 4. Crisp County SWM Increase. We can expect our fees for solid waste management to increase by 2.7% as of January 1, 2019.
 - ACCG Local Gov't Federal Advocacy Forum. You are invited to attend on November 1 in Macon from 1- 4 pm. Registration is required.
 - 6. **2019 LMIG.** Chairman Williams asked Engineer Paul Rakel to rank (traffic pressure, citizens impacted, and road condition) of several local road projects to give us an empirical way to judge how to use the 2019 LMIG funds of \$323,062.01. (We will be required a 10% match.)
 - 7. <u>Code Enforcement Conference.</u> Al Brinson (Maintenance) and I attended the Georgia Association of Code Enforcement (GACE) Fall Conference last week.
 - 8. <u>Levy on Land.</u> Following the donation of the Mathis House property from the Sheriff to the Commission, we didn't get the property put into the Commission's name. Therefore, we'll have to pay the tax bill to avoid a tax sale. This amounts to \$389.62, which, of course, comes back to the Commission.
 - 9. <u>2019 SPLOST Educational Campaign.</u> I will be preparing some educational information to publish concerning the upcoming SPLOST vote.

- 10. Idealist Ventures. County Attorney Bin Minter's wife, Lauren Minter, has graciously volunteered to do some design work suggestions for us to consider as a way to build her client list for her new business. The initial project will be a design for the Community Group's effort to do entranceway beautification. She will also work on a re-design of our corporate seal, which is now obsolete, because it contains Westville as a component.
- 11. Code Red. We are now beginning to work with Onsolve to get people listed with Code Red.
- 12. Safety Coordinator Training. I completed this annual training on August 28.
- 13. EMS Building. We have postponed the EMS building bid date until we can present an architectural drawing. I have contacted 3 architects including Mr. Stankus in Richland, GA. Commissioner Williams - We have not been moving forward with this project. We really need to move forward. We at least need to get a drawing and utilize our resources. We may not have the money now but we can make any efforts to borrow, etc. If we want this building we need to start on it.
- 14. L4GA "Get Lit!" Campaign. I attended the campaign kick-off. The Board of Education is promoting that each family should read together for twenty minutes after supper.
- 15. Maintenance Report. Al Brinson did the following work for the Commission: installed two hand-dryers at the health department; but a new lock on the ladies' restroom; replace light bulbs at the health department inside and out; replaced two security lights at the health department; braced the handrail at the health department; installed new window casings, painted window trim, and washed exterior windows at the health department; rescreened the windows at the health department; worked on the wall in the elections office; worked on the sump in the basement of the courthouse; repaired the shower at the MR Center; and attended the code enforcement conference at Callaway.

B. EMS Director - Ed Lynch

- 1. Jennifer Jill Walker's Resignation Jill Walker has resigned from her position. We are going to have to hire someone immediately for full-time. We need to also review the budget. Vice Chair Scott - If we want good qualified people, we need to pay them. County Manager - Ed needs to make a recommendation to the commission as a department head.
- 2. Trailer Quotes Trailer quotes were distributed to Commissioners for review. Of all quotes submitted, Ed Lynch would like to accept the quote from RKO Enterprise for \$4,270.00 with removable trailer and get the trailer from Chattahoochee Trailer for \$2,200.
- 3. Volunteer Fire Fighters Omaha is my best group. The others are not hiring. We have one prospect in Louvale and Brooklyn, but we had to shut down the station. Have you considered hiring full-time or utilizing the road department? There is a 400 hour training required that has to be completed first. County Manager - We can consider paying them to take the training as an incentive. Chairman - We need to hire someone and put something in the budget. Ed will need to bring something in for review on the firefighters.
- C. Eugene Haynes Road Superintendent
 - 1. We have slowed down on cutting the grass on the roads because we have been doing some maintenance.
 - 2. We will request more money in the budget for spraying. There is a product that can be used to slow down the growth of the grass. Chairman Williams - Please do a comparison and let us know your recommendation.
